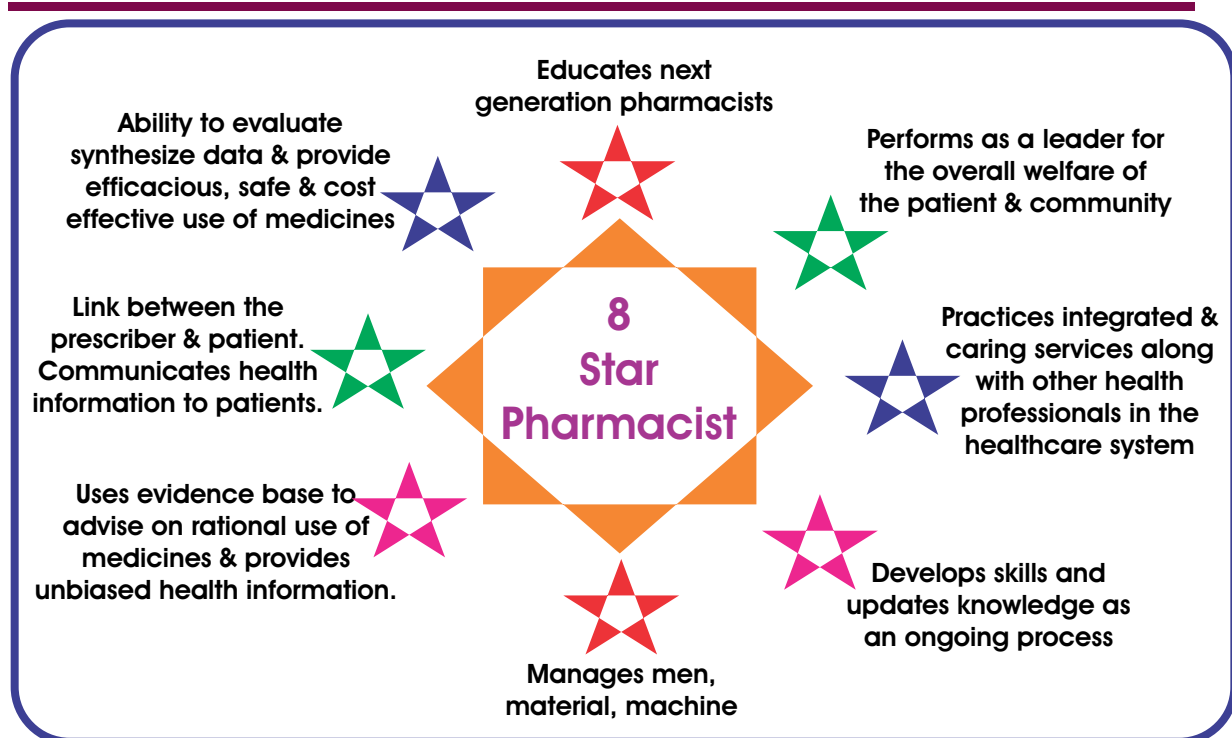

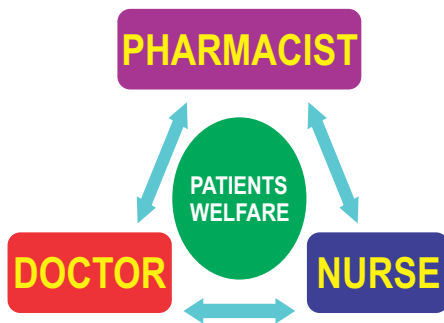

## Eligibility for Admission

### M.Pharm

A Candidate who has passed B.Pharm degree examination of Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, or B.Pharm examination of any other Indian University established by law in India or any other degree course in Pharmacy recognized as equivalent by RGUHS or Pharmacy Council of India (PCI), All Indian Council of Technical Education (AICTE) for this purpose and who has secured not less than 55% of the maximum marks (aggregate of 4 Years) prescribed for the qualifying examination shall be eligible for admission to M.Pharm course.

**Duration of the course:** The course study including submission of a dissertation on the research project assigned shall be of 24 months (2 years) duration.

### B.Pharm

Candidates who have passed two year P.U.C. examination of Karnataka P.U.C. Board or an equivalent examination of any other approved Board or University with not less than 40% marks in any combination comprising P.C.M. or P.C.B. (Minimum eligibility should be based on the aggregate of P.C.M. or P.C.B.) or P.C.M.B., P.C. and Computer Sciences, P.C. and Electronics.

#### Note:

- 1) In respect of candidates who have taken P.C.M.B. combination, the aggregate of P.C.M. Or P.C.B. whichever is higher shall be considered for the purpose of admission.
- 2) In the case of students belonging to SC/ST / Category- I/OBC, the minimum percentage of marks for the admission to B.Pharm course shall be not less than 35% in P.U.C. or its equivalent examination (P.C.B. or P.C.M. or P.C.M.B.), P.C. and Computer Science, P.C and Electronics and D. Pharma.

### II B. Pharm

II B Pharma direct admission: A pass in D. Pharm (Lateral Entry)

**Duration of the course:** The course of study for B.Pharm shall extend over a period of four academic years. The curricula and syllabi for the course shall be prescribed from time to time.

### D.Pharm

Minimum Qualification for admission to Diploma in pharmacy, pass in any of the following examination with Physics, Chemistry & Biology or Mathematics.

1. Intermediate examination in Science
2. 10+2 Examination (Academic Stream) in Science
3. Pre-degree examination
4. Any other qualification approved by the Pharmacy Council of India as equal to any of the above examination.

**Duration of the course:** The duration of the course shall be for two academic years.

### Pharm D

Candidates who have passed two year P.U.C. examination of Karnataka P.U.C. Board or an equivalent examination of any other approved Board or University established by law in India with English as one of the subject and Physics, Chemistry as compulsory subjects along with one of the following subject – Mathematics or Biology or P.C.M.B. Minimum eligibility should be based on the aggregate of P.C.M. or P.C.B.

Candidates who have passed D.Pharm course from institutions approved by Pharmacy

## Admission Procedure

The Application Form and prospectus can be obtained from the College Office on payment of cash Rs.300/- or by post Rs. 350/- of a crossed D.D. drawn in favour. **“The Principal, Sree Siddaganga College of Pharmacy, B. H. Road, Tumkur-572102”**. Duly filled application form should be submitted to the college office within the stipulated period.

While appearing for admission interview, kindly bring the following ORIGINAL document and fee.

1. 10+2 mark sheet
2. 10th mark sheet
3. Transfer certificate from the college last studied
4. Migration certificate from the board
5. Character and conduct certificate
6. 3 copies of passport size photograph
7. College annual fee: A crossed D.D. drawn in favour of **“THE PRINCIPAL, SREE SIDDAGANGA COLLEGE OF PHARMACY, TUMKUR”**. Payable at TUMKUR from any Nationalised Bank. For admission the candidate himself / herself or accompanied by his/ her parent/guardian meet the principal directly in the college office with the above said documents.

Selected candidates can confirm their seat by depositing the prescribed college fee and original documents in the office.

## Code of discipline of the College

- ❖ Students must maintain perfect discipline in the campus of the institute and in its hostels. They should observe the following rules strictly
- ❖ They should not participate in any strikes or demonstrations nor encourage to do so.
- ❖ They should not involve themselves in any act, which will lower the prestige of our college.
- ❖ They should not absent themselves from the classes or examinations without the prior permission of the principal.
- ❖ They should neither misbehave nor should they show disrespect to any staff member of the college.
- ❖ They should not meddle with the instrument in the laboratories without the permission of the staff members in-charge.
- ❖ They should maintain silence in the classrooms, library and work quietly in the laboratories.
- ❖ Student who come to the classes late should seek the permission of the members of the staff before entering.
- ❖ They should abide by the rules and regulation of the college.
- ❖ If they violate the general code of discipline of the college, they are liable to be punished. Depending upon the nature of the misconduct, the punishment will be in the form of fine, suspension from the college for a definite period or expulsion from the college.

## RAGGING AND PUNISHMENT

**Ragging** means causing, inducing, compelling, forcing a student either by way of practical joke or otherwise, today any act which detracts from human dignity or violates his/her person or exposes him/her to ridicule or to forebear from doing any lawful act by intimidating, wrongfully restraining, wrongly confining, or injuring him/her or by using criminal force, extortion.

The following perverse actions also constitute the ragging.

- 1) Forcing to: Address seniors as SIRS, Perform mass drills, Copy class notes and practical records for seniors, Carry out various errands, Do menial jobs for seniors, Drink alcohol and consume drugs, Do acts with sexual overtones and homosexual acts leading to physical injury/mental torture or death.
- 2) Stripping/Kissing
- 3) Any other related or allied acts of commission would also form ragging.

### PUNISHMENT FOR ERRANT STUDENTS (RAGGERS)

1. Filing of first information report (FIR) with the local police as per the Supreme Court direction.
2. Publishing the photographs of errant students (raggers) on the Notice Boards and in Local Newspapers.
3. Imprisonment for term extendable up to one year or a fine of Rs.2000.00 or both.
4. Rustication, dismissal and expulsion from the institute.
5. Embossment on marks cards and other academic certificates that he/she was indulged in ragging.
6. Non eligibility for getting passport or visa.
7. Non eligibility for campus recruitment/cancellation, if selected already.

### PUNITIVE ACTION AGAINST NON-COMPLYING INSTITUTIONS

In case of the institutes having failed to combat ragging in any form, the State Governments and universities should take cognizance of the failure of mechanism in the administrative machinery of the institute and treat this as ground for the disaffiliation of the institute. The regulatory bodies such as UGC/AICTE and State Governments should freeze the release of grants to such institutes.

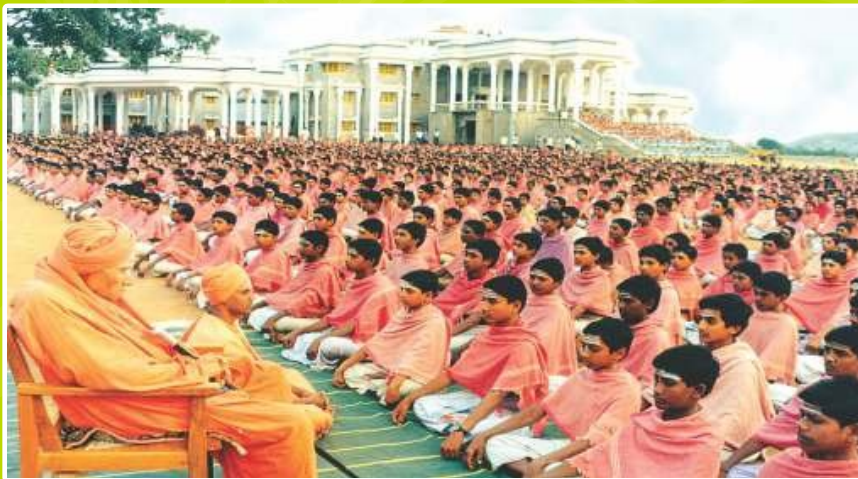

- ❖ Pharmacists will actively involve in the national health programmes like promotion of essential medicines, primary health care, HIV/ AIDS, TB, Malaria, tobacco use or family planning.
- ❖ Pharmacists will become knowledgeable to participate in medication management and outcome monitoring, including the ability to alter doses and change medicines with agreed therapeutic protocols.
